### **Purpose of this Guide**

This Guide lists services that are available to aid formerly incarcerated folks in the re-entry process. This Guide is best suited for folks who are approximately a year from release or who have a release date. If that is you, congratulations! PAN is excited to welcome you back into the community.

Organizations included in this Guide serve the Central California counties listed above. On the following page, the Table of Contents lays out the organization of this Guide. In the first few pages, you will find general information about important processes and documents needed for release. A list of general hotlines, including emergency lines, as well as common national and statewide organizations follows. These hotlines and national/statewide organizations can be accessed from any location in California.

The remainder of this Guide is divided by county. Once you know where you will be located post-release, determine which county is appropriate and find that county listed in the Table of Contents. Turn to that county's page to see the organizations and services PAN has contacted. Within each county, the service organizations are listed in alphabetical order according to the type of services they provide. Included organizations provide a variety of services, such as education and employment opportunities, legal services, housing services, healthcare, and treatment. Most entries include websites, phone numbers, and physical addresses folks can contact to ask about the organization's services and how to receive help. Please be aware that many of the organizations in this Guide may not accept collect calls.

### **Your Responsibility in Using this Guide**

PAN's Reentry Guide is not intended to give legal advice, but rather to share general re-entry information and resources. PAN is not able to provide any advice regarding specific re-entry plans. No attorney-client relationship is created with PAN through use of this Guide. Consult an attorney for legal advice specific to your situation.

PAN strives to share useful and accurate information in this Guide because we understand that currently or formerly incarcerated folks have difficulty getting information for re-entry support. **This guide is up to date as of March 2021.** Where indicated, organizations are open and functioning (with some modifications due to the COVID-19 pandemic). As the COVID-19 pandemic progresses, each of the organizations listed may experience changes in services or hours in order to comply with state and county rules. Though PAN verified their status during the COVID-19 pandemic as of March 2021, PAN will not have resources to make any updates to this Guide in the future. If you use this Guide, it is your responsibility to contact organizations you are interested in to ensure they are still providing applicable services.

Please be in touch if you are located in the Bay Area after your release and are interested in becoming a member of PAN – we value the knowledge and experience that you bring to the movement on behalf of the incarcerated.

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### Parole/Release Documents Basics

*This guide is not a parole preparation guide, and PAN cannot provide support for parole. However, below, we detail the basic steps and documents needed for any type of release, whether that is through parole, resentencing, or standard release. These steps can help you think about the documents and resources you will need.*

1. **Case Documents:** particularly the Abstract of Judgment
2. **Parole Plans:** a 2-3 page outline of your support network including: housing and job offers, family support in the county, AA/NA meetings in the area, public benefits you qualify for (e.g. MediCal, SSI/SSDI, etc.), faith communities (churches, mosques, synagogues, etc.), etc.
3. **Relapse Prevention Plan:** a 1-3 page outline of your triggers and your coping skills, and the support network you’ll turn to when feeling triggered.
4. **Letter of Remorse** that are **solely focused on expressing remorse** about harm caused, to the Victim, Victim’s Family, and/or Society at large.
5. **Letter of Insight / Statement of Accountability:** This letter should discuss your **insight** into your causative factors and triggers, your accountability for the harm caused, and your insight and change after recent write-ups or disciplinary actions.
6. **Resume:** List your job assignments, educational achievements, certifications, awards, degrees, and employable skills both before and during your incarceration.
7. **Support Letters (Character Witness letters, and Parole Support offers)**
  - From Wardens, Associate Wardens, and Correctional Officers
  - Letters from Program Staff, Chaplains, and Volunteers
  - From Potential Employers (Job Offer letters)
  - From Transitional Housing (Housing Offer letters)
  - From Victim or Victim’s Family
  - From Currently and Formerly Incarcerated Peers
  - From Family and Friends
  - From Spiritual Leaders, Community Leaders, and Politicians
  - From community-based organizations with reentry support offers
  - From NA/AA sponsors, support group leaders, etc.
8. **Chronos and Certificates:** Organized by most recent and most relevant programming to causative factors.
9. **Book Reports** on topics such as: substance abuse, anger management, domestic violence, and what the Board of Parole Hearings refers to as “criminal thinking” and “causative factors”.
  - Book reports are most useful when they address topics that are related to someone's crime of commitment or conviction, or issues that have come up during incarceration regarding disciplinary records. Book reports should focus on what someone learned about themselves from reading a book, not about the book itself.

## Overview of Key Documents

This is a list of documents that are necessary or helpful for establishing yourself post-release. They can be helpful for job applications, attaining education, finding housing, traveling, and more. This list includes basic information about the purpose and function of each document. Please note that this list is not exhaustive, and there may be other important documents or forms of identification required for your specific situation.

Document	Basic Information
U.S. Birth Certificate	U.S. Birth Certificates certify your legal name, birthdate, place of birth, and age. Having your birth certificate is often necessary to attain other important identifying documents like the ones listed below. More information about getting your Birth Certificate is on the following page.
Naturalization Certificate	A Naturalization Certificate is the document that certifies you as a citizen of the United States. You may have this certificate if you were born outside the United States and became a citizen later. You will not have a U.S. Birth Certificate, and you can use a Naturalization Certificate in its place for getting other important documents. Some details on how to obtain your Naturalization Certificate is on the following page.
Social Security Card	Your Social Security Card lists your Social Security Number (SSN), which is often required to attain a job, as well as for applying for educational programs, financial aid, and other government services. It is often necessary to obtain other identifying documents like the ones listed below.
California ID  AND/OR  California Driver's License	<p>Your California ID can be used to establish your residency in California, as well as proving your age and identity. It does not give you driving privileges in the state of California but can be useful in opening a bank account, registering to vote, or taking advantage of other public benefits.</p> <p>Your California Driver's License functions much like your California ID in that it helps establish your residency in California and can be used to prove your age and identity. A California Driver's License is necessary to be able to operate a vehicle, and to do so, you must take driving lessons and pass the required exams.</p> <p>It is not necessary to obtain both a California ID and California Driver's License; one form of identification is sufficient. The primary consideration is whether you need the driver's license so you can operate a vehicle in the state of California. A standard driver's license from California also allows you to operate vehicles in other states.</p>
California Voter Registration	When applying for a California ID or Driver's License, you are often able to register to vote at the same time if you are over 18 years of age. Once you are registered to vote, you may vote in all local, state, and federal elections in the state of California.
U.S. Passport	Your U.S. Passport is necessary for travel outside of the United States and can be used as another form of government-issued ID.
Tribal ID Card	Your Tribal ID Card proves your enrollment in a particular Native American or Alaska Native tribe, can be used as a form of personal identification, and can be used to access certain services provided for Native Americans.
Library Card	This is an optional card that can give you access to the public library in your county. You can rent books and movies from the library and librarians are often available to give advice about any resources you may need.

## **Getting Your Birth Certificate**

There are several important documents you need to reestablish yourself, apply for school, work, housing, and more. Your birth certificate is one of the most important ones and is easy to get while still incarcerated. This is a document that proves your legal name, birthdate, age, and place of birth. You must request your birth certificate from your state of birth.

### **Required Information:**

- Full name of person whose record is requested.
- Sex assigned at birth
- Parents' names, including maiden name of mother.
- Month, day, and year of birth or death.
- Place of birth or death (city or town, county, and State; and name of hospital, if known).
- Purpose for which copy is needed.
- Relationship to person whose record is requested.
- Day time telephone number with area code.

#### **Naturalized Citizens:**

- If you were born outside the United States, immigrated to the United States, and are now a U.S. citizen, you would have received a *Certificate of Naturalization* at the time you were naturalized. This document can replace your birth certificate.
- You can request the application to receive your *Certificate of Naturalization* by calling the Department of Homeland Security, Citizenship and Immigration Services, National Customer Services Center hotline at 1-800-375-5283. The application form to receive your certificate can also be found at [uscis.gov/n-565](http://uscis.gov/n-565).

#### **Born Abroad and Adopted by US Parents:**

- If you were born outside the US and later adopted by US parents, you may have a *Certificate of Naturalization*. This document can be used as an identification document.
- If not, you can contact the embassy at your country of birth to request documentation. Call U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services for help at 1-800-375-5283 or go online at [travel.state.gov](http://travel.state.gov) → [Contact Info for Foreign Embassies and Consulates](#).

#### **Not a Citizen of the United States:**

**Note:** Always use your **legal** name (written on your birth certificate) when applying for forms of ID. Using a false name or presenting false documentation is a **federal offense**.
